Shortly before the turn, the pressure from both outside and eventually on the inside of the colt appeared. Tommy did not panic, but instead simply continued to ride out his mount, and Skylimit did the rest. When challenged, Skylimit found another gear or two and despite for a fleeting moment looking as if he might be relegated from the winner's circle, the colt eventually fought off all the late comers to record a both classy and tenacious debut victory.

The progeny of Flying Spur have been winning over a variety of distances of late, and we know what Skylimit's dam has produced in the way of speed.
